HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

FRASER W. LOCKWOOD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

One award valued at \$2,500 minimum (applied directly to tuition) renewable for duration of 4 years of consecutive study as long as criteria continue to be met. For students (Canadian citizens or Permanent residents) entering their first year of full-time studies in their first undergraduate program. Good academic standing (minimum 65 per cent average in five academic courses, three of which must include Math 30, Math 31, Chemistry 30, Biology 30, Physics 30 or English 30) and acceptance to university or college. Preference is given to those students with financial need who are members or whose parents are members of a Filipino cultural association. Student demonstrates commitment to community development and leadership. Has contributed to the community by volunteering through community organizations, athletics, and cultural or political activities.

\$2,500, one award. Apply to: TCF. Deadline: June 30.

GORDON SKITCH SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is for Grade 12 student with Cerebral Palsy enrolled in high school (CBE and Calgary Catholic). Scholarship is to motivate a deserving student to prepare for post-secondary who may be discouraged from doing so by reason of financial need. Community service, financial need, and scholastic achievement are required.

\$470, one award. Apply to: Cerebral Palsy Association in Alberta.

JANE MCCAIG AWARD

Scholarship is for Grade 9, 10, or 11 student providing motivation to continue learning through a very challenging period in their life. Applicant must be an all around good student who has exhibited significant improvement, is enjoying school and is serving as a role model.

\$1,000, one award. Apply to: Calgary Academy.

JIM & MERTIE CHILTON SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Mr. Jim Chilton. Scholarship is for positive, highly motivated academic Grade 12 student having the highest academic average in the sciences and involved in leadership roles. Provides financial support for pursuit of

post-secondary education.

\$1,300, one award. Apply to: Willow Creek Composite.

JOHN MICHAEL FLANAGAN BURSARY

Scholarship is to motivate a student for post-secondary education who might otherwise be discouraged from doing so by reason of financial need. Applicant must be Grade 11 student enrolled in a Catholic high school in Calgary, student is selected prior to entering Grade 12. Student must show financial need and community service.

\$1,500, one award. Nominated by Calgary Catholic School District.

KERRY DYTE EDUCATION AWARD

For a student who attended a Catholic high school in Calgary during the year the application is made. Demonstrated outstanding citizenship and leadership, financial need.

\$3,000, one award. Apply to: CSSD Scholarship Coordinator. Deadline: May 31.

LINDSAY LEIGH KIMMETT MEMORIAL FOUNDATION VALEDICTORIAN SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is for top academic students involved in extra-curricular activities to take on the role of class valedictorian.

\$1,000, two awards. Apply to: Bow Valley High School and Cochrane High School.

M. CECIL BROWNLEE BURSARY

Scholarship is to encourage deserving students in Grade 10 to prepare for post-secondary education, who might be discouraged from so doing by reason of financial need. Applicant must show academic achievement, citizenship and financial need.

One award per school, variable amount. Apply to: EducationMatters.

SCOTT BOBYE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is in memory of Scott Bobye, and recognizes proficiency of a Grade 12 student entering university in the junior achievement business program.

\$1,000, one award. Apply to: Junior Achievement of Southern Alberta.

SINGLETON FAMILY AWARD

This scholarship was established to assist Calgary Board of Education high school students who have demonstrated academic abilities, community service and have financial need

to realize their goal to attend post-secondary institutions.

\$1,350, one award. Apply to: EducationMatters.

SCHOOL SPECIFIC

ALTON ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Recognizes academic achievement determined by Saint John's.

\$500, one award. Apply to: Saint John's School (Pending).

CENTRAL ALUMNI PERSONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD

Scholarship recognizes graduates at Central Memorial Senior High School who have achieved high academic excellence and achievement in the areas of athletics and citizenship.

\$350, two awards. Apply to: Central Memorial.

CHRIS AND BETTY HARVEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Chris and Betty Harvey, Rimbey Junior Senior High School selects a graduating Grade 12 student with qualifying Grades to enter university, college or technical school. Award is based on financial need and community involvement.

One award, variable amount. Apply to: Rimbey Junior Senior High.

CHRISTINE CARRON MATH AWARD

This award was named in memory of Christine Carron, an 18 year old Ridgetown District High School (RDHS) graduate who died in July 1977 as a result of complications from a dental procedure. She was an Ontario scholar, the Graduating Class Grad Queen, and the President of her class. Math was one of her favourite subjects. Friends and family started the award for the student receiving the highest math marks in the graduating class at RDHS.

\$275, one award. Apply to: RDHS.

CLAPHAM BURSARY

Awarded annually to a Central Memorial High School student planning to attend a post-secondary institution. The award is based on the following criteria: financial need, satisfactory academic standing, extracurricular activities, for example, involvement in sports or music.

\$500, one award. Apply to: Central Memorial

CONNOR RHYS SIMPSON MEMORIAL AWARD

The Selection Committee at Western Canada High School selects the student whose Grades have most improved from Grade 11 to Grade 12.

\$500, one award. Apply to: Western Canada High School.

DENNIS ANDERSON CITIZENSHIP AWARDS

This scholarship recognizes outstanding students who show civic engagement, involvement in their student council and community leadership.

One award per school, variable amount. Nominated by: Bishop Carroll, Bishop Pinkham Jr., Central Memorial and Lord Shawnessy Secondary, St. James Elementary and Junior High.

DR. G. FRED MCNALLY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in fond memory of Dr. McNally, a noted Alberta educator, this scholarship supports a graduating student from Western Canada High School with outstanding academic performance, good citizenship, extra-curricular activities, school and community volunteerism.

\$1,000, one award. Apply to: Western Canada High School.

DR. JAMES DUNCAN CAMPBELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Dr. James Duncan Campbell Memorial Scholarship was established to honor the life and accomplishments of Dr. James Campbell. Dr. Campbell's connection to Crescent Heights High School was a significant part of his life. His father was a teacher there, Dr. Campbell was an alumnus of the school and his five children also graduated from Crescent Heights. Recognizes excellence in academic achievement.

\$375, one award. Apply to: Crescent Heights High School.

DR. M. E. KOZIOL MEMORIAL AWARD

In memory of Dr. M.E. Koziol to recognize high school students graduating from County of Vulcan pursuing a career in medicine, nursing or health sciences.

\$500, one award. Apply to: County Central High School Vulcan.

DRUMHELLER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is for Grade 12 students from Drumheller Composite High School continuing education at any university, vocational

school or college. Applicant must show scholastic excellence and be pursuing studies in classical music or medicine. Leadership, volunteerism, caring, and helpful to others, personal integrity and Christian values, financial need, rating of classmates also required.

\$5,000, two, two year awards. Apply to: Drumheller Composite High School.

EDWIN B. CALLAWAY SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Edwin B. Callaway. Scholarship is for a Saint John's student with proficiency in written or oral communication skills in such areas as parliament, creative writing, literature, history and debating.

\$500, one award. Apply to: Saint John's School (Pending).

HASKAYNE, GLEICHEN CLUNY BASSANO ENTRANCE AWARDS

Dick and Lois Haskayne recognize the importance of post-secondary education in preparing students for their careers and feel that it may be challenging for students from small communities to attend post-secondary studies away from home. Through these awards, they hope that students will be able to pursue educational goals with confidence.

\$4,000, variable number of awards. Apply to: Gleichen, Cluny and Bassano High Schools.

JACK & JANET KWONG BURSARY

To support students in financial need who are attending Calgary Chinese Public School.

\$1,475, one award. Apply to: Calgary Chinese Public School.

JONATHAN PAUL SCOTT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is for Grade 1-12 student at Queen Margaret's. Student has made significant progress during the school year, has returned for subsequent year, and is in financial need.

\$380, one award. Apply to: Queen Margaret's School, Duncan, BC.

JORDAN ROPPEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Jordan Roppel, this scholarship supports graduates of Standard High School who are continuing their education. Community participation, extra-curricular school activities and overall character of the applicant will be considered.

\$500, one award. Apply to: Standard High School.

K.C. YEUNG MEMORIAL AWARD

This scholarship is to help students attending the Calgary Chinese Public School.

\$780, one award. Apply to: Calgary Chinese Public School.

MICHAEL COPELAND MEMORIAL AWARD

In memory of Michael Copeland this scholarship recognizes students or staff at the Strathcona-Tweedsmuir School who, by way of a specific act or project, have made significant contributions to the well-being of the school.

\$500, one award. Apply to: Strathcona-Tweedsmuir.

NICK GALLELLI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship for a Grade 12 student enrolled in St. Francis Senior High School in Calgary. Student must plan on pursuing post-secondary education with a major in business, business administration, commerce, economics, finance or accounting. Purpose of award is to motivate a deserving student in Grade 12 to prepare for university or other post-secondary education, who might otherwise be discouraged by reason of financial need. Community service is also required.

\$1,200, one award. Apply to: St. Francis.

OWEN HART MEMORIAL AWARDS

In memory of Owen Hart who died while working for WWF. These awards at Forest Lawn High School recognize students who are motivated to improve their lives through education. Applicants must be graduating and plan to attend an accredited Canadian post-secondary institution in the next academic year. Applicants must have at least a 70 per cent average or post-secondary entry requirement. Preference given to students employed part-time, and in financial need.

\$4,000, ten awards. Apply to: Forest Lawn High School. Deadline: June 30.

PATRICIA G. HUNT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for a student attending Saint John's School of Alberta.

\$185, one award. Apply to: Saint John's School (Pending).

ROBERTA KNIGHT-GIBSON AWARD

This scholarship supports students registered in continuing education or high school credit English.

\$350, one award. Apply to: Chinook College.

TING HOKNIN MEMORIAL AWARD

This scholarship, supported by the Sino-Canada Culture Association, helps students attending the Calgary Chinese School. \$650, one award. Apply to: Sino-Canada Culture Association.

Awards are for students with academic merit (min. 3.00 GPA), and participation in extracurricular activities, an interest in sales and in life insurance industry, Canadian citizen or permanent resident. \$2,000, two awards. Apply to: U of C.

ALBERTA GEOMATICS GROUP SCHOLARSHIP FUND

It is the intention of the AGG that through this scholarship, further advancement of the geomatics industry will be facilitated by supporting students who demonstrate an interest in the use of geomatics technology within their field of study. Based on academic merit, offered annually to a continuing undergraduate student entering 3rd or 4th year in any faculty. \$500, one award. Apply to: U of C

FOGOLÂR FURLAN DI CALGARY SCHOLARSHIP IN ITALIAN STUDIES

Established by the Fogolâr Furlan di Calgary to promote education and provide financial assistance for residents of Alberta, majoring or minoring in Italian studies, undergraduate entering 3rd or 4th year of full-time studies, with a GPA of 3.0 or higher in the previous year. \$1,500, one award. Apply to: TCF. Deadline: May 30.

LINDSAY LEIGH KIMMETT PRIZE IN EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Lindsay Kimmett was completing her second year of medical school when she was tragically killed in a motor vehicle accident. Lindsay was passionate about medicine and had chosen Emergency Medicine as her career goal. Offered annually to graduating students in an Emergency Medicine program in the Faculty of Medicine. Based on academic merit, preference will be given to students who show exceptional leadership and involvement in the athletics program. \$2,525, one award. Apply to: U of C.

PHYLLIS WESTON SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Phyllis Weston who taught for 40 years in Calgary Public Schools. Her teaching had a lasting impact on many students. Scholarship is for Canadian citizen, Alberta resident who attended their final year of high school in Calgary, full-time students registered at U of C, U of A, or U of L entering their final year of studies in an education degree program, specializing in English. Good academic standing is required. \$1,350, one award. Apply to: TCF. Deadline: June 30.

SCHOOL SPECIFIC

ARLENE & GLEN JOHNSTON BURSARY

Scholarship is for a 4th year undergrad nursing student, academic merit, financial need, full-time status. \$1,500, one award. Apply to: U of C.

BEA HUNTER EASTERN STAR BURSARY

This award has been set up to honour the memory of Bea Hunter, a long standing member of the Chinook Chapter of the Eastern Star. Bea had a great love of the health sector; it was always a dream of hers to become a nurse. This award recognizes a student in their 2nd year of the Practical Nurse program. Requirements are academic improvement, excellent attendance, community/volunteer involvement, financial need. \$500, one award. Apply to: BVC.

CALGARY SCHOLARSHIP FUND FOR IMMIGRANTS

Scholarship is for an immigrant student attending SAIT, entering 3rd year in 5th semester, with good standing and financial need. Applicant must be a landed immigrant or person who was landed immigrant and is now Canadian citizen. \$1,500, one award. Apply to: SAIT.

CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF PETROLEUM PRODUCERS (CAPP)

CAPP is the voice of Canada's upstream oil and natural gas industry, representing over 130 member companies. CAPP's mission is to enhance the economic well-being and sustainability of the industry in a socially, environmentally and technically responsible and safe manner. These awards are based on academic achievement and financial need for students in specific programs in the following faculties: Engineering, Science, Manage-

ment, Engineering & Technology, Science Technology as detailed by each institution. Apply to: Grande Prairie Regional College, Grant MacEwan, U of L, U of A, U of C, MRC, SAIT, NAIT.

DONNA MAY MOORE MEMORIAL AWARD

In memory of Donna May Moore, the supervisor of the Calgary General Hospital E.E.G. Lab, this scholarship is to provide a bursary for students undertaking their practicum in Alberta/BC who are attending BCIT Electroneurophysiology Program. Preference is given to students doing their practicum at a Calgary hospital, then Alberta hospitals, and then BC hospitals. \$1,100, one award. Apply to: Department of Electroneurophysiology, BCIT.

DOROTHY M. NORTON SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Applicant must be an English Major, min. 3.5 GPA, full course load, Canadian citizen, graduated from a Calgary high school. In case of tie, financial need will be considered. \$1,000, one award. Apply to: U of C.

DR. HELEN REYNOLDS BELYEA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Dr. Helen Reynolds Belyea. Applicant must be active member of Delta Nu Chapter of Alpha Gamma Delta, completed one or more years of undergraduate studies with a minimum 3.00 GPA, registered as a full-time student at U of C. \$350, one award. Apply to: U of C.

ELMER AND PENNY HARBRIDGE BURSARIES

For students entering their first, second or third year in the Faculty of Medicine MD program at the U of C. The awards are based on financial need. \$4,000, two awards. Apply to: U of C.

EVA REID MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Honors the memory of Eva Reid (1906-1989), a pioneer in journalism in Alberta. She began her newspaper career when she joined the Alberta Social Credit Chronicle as circulation manager and later was given a column to write. When the Chronicle was sold to the Albertan in 1937, Reid was appointed provincial editor. In 1941, she became women's editor but also served as police-court reporter for a short time in the mid 1940s. After World War II, she became full-time women's editor for twenty years. Scholarship is for full-time

student in 2nd year of Bachelor of Applied Communications - Journalism program. Enthusiasm, financial need, and a minimum 3.25 GPA in first year.

\$500, one award. Apply to: MRC.

FRANCES CAMYRE MEMORIAL AWARDS

In memory of Frances Camyre, a pioneering businesswoman in the oil and gas industry, these scholarships are for full-time students with scholastic standing, personal character and financial need enrolled in agricultural business, land & water resources, land information systems, land agent, land administration, office administration. Students must have completed at least one full semester and have been a resident of Alberta continuously for at least five years.

Apply to: Olds College, Grande Prairie Regional College, Grant McEwan, SAIT, NAIT, Lakeland College, U of A, U of C, U of L.

FROST BURSARIES

Offered annually to continuing undergraduate students enrolled in BA Dance degree in the Faculty of Arts at the U of C. These awards are based on academic merit and financial need.

\$1,800, two awards. Apply to: U of C.

H. A. WOODROFFE SCHOLARSHIP

These scholarships are for students in Electronics Engineering Technology program. Applicants must display academic achievement and financial need.

\$1,000, 11 awards. Apply to: SAIT.

JAMES AUBREY AND DORIS GARNER MEMORIAL BURSARY

Olds College - Bachelor of Applied Agricultural Technology & Entrepreneurship. Applicant must be Canadian Citizen, third year student in financial need, academic achievement, desire to further the family farm or small agricultural related business.

University of Guelph - The family of the late James and Doris Garner provides a scholarship annually to a student enrolled in Phase II of the Executive MBA program. Preference given to a student who has financial need, desire to further the cause of family-owned farms and small-scale agri-business, and demonstrates high academic standing. Preference will be given to Canadian citizens.

\$2,500. Apply to: Olds College, University of Guelph, U of C.

JOHN SHIRRA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, in memory of John Shirra, provides a bursary to students enrolled in 3rd or 4th year of Bachelor of Commerce program, Haskayne School of Business showing community involvement, athletic achievement, entrepreneurial spirit, academic credentials. Financial need may also be considered.

\$1,500, two awards. Apply to: Assistant Dean, Undergraduate Programs, Haskayne School of Business, U of C.

LEVIS FAMILY BURSARY FOR HEALTH EDUCATION

Scholarship is for part time/full time students in financial need studying for a career in Health Education.

\$500, three awards. Apply to: MRC, SAIT, U of C.

NEW SUN JOY HARVIE MACLAREN AWARDS

Established by Joy Harvie Maclaren in honour of her father, Eric Harvie. Scholarships recognize students who have demonstrated academic achievement, outstanding citizenship qualities, and extra-curricular involvement in the preservation of traditional Native culture. Good academic standing and financial need will be considered. Applicant must be of First Nations/Inuit ancestry, full-time in any year of study, and have a minimum GPA of 3.0. Applicants must submit a brief summary demonstrating their involvement in participating and reviving traditional native culture.

\$1,500-5,000. Apply to: U of A, U of C, MRC, SAIT, U of L, Nunavut Arctic College.

PETE CINDRIC BURSARIES

This scholarship is awarded to a student in financial need enrolled in third or fourth semester. Must be a Canadian Citizen.

\$700, two awards. Apply to: SAIT.

RALPH KLEIN SCHOLARSHIP

As a tribute to Ralph Klein and his public service, over 160 individuals and companies organized a golf tournament to raise funds for the Klein Foundation. Applicants must be full- or part-time students from any department, with academic competence. Scholarships assist disadvantaged students who are in financial need. Priority given to single mothers with dependent children.

\$1,850, two awards. Apply to: BVC.

ROBERT M. POGUE STUDENT AWARD

The Robert M. Pogue Student Award Fund was established by Mr. Pogue who graduated from the U of A, School of Commerce, class of 1959. Mr. Pogue was an active member of the University community through the Kappa Sigma Fraternity and held various executive positions of the Fraternity. Upon graduating with a BA, Mr. Pogue went on to create, own and operate several successful businesses in Alberta. Applicant must demonstrate leadership or contributions to the university community by holding a position of responsibility with a university organization. Demonstrated financial need is also required. Applicant must be an Alberta resident or a graduate from an Alberta high school. Applicant must be completing the third to final year of study in a business degree program, demonstrate a satisfactory scholastic standing, and good personal character.

\$500, one award. Apply to: U of A even years, U of C odd years.

SCHULTZ BURSARY

Bridge/EAP Recognition Awards (ESL). These awards provide recognition to students at BVC enrolled in the Bridge and English for Academic Purpose (EAP) Programs within the English as a Second Language Department. Award is based on financial need, attendance record, positive attitude towards self and others, and academic improvement.

\$500, four awards. Apply to: BVC.

SCOTT RAIDAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Dr. Scott Rairdan, a friend to many in the Charolais industry and the Canadian International Cattle Business. Scholarships and bursaries are offered at various institutions to students in agricultural studies.

\$750-\$2,000. Apply to: 4H Foundation of Alberta, Lakeland College, U of S Veterinary College, Cochrane High School, Clearview School District, Olds College.

SUSAN LLOYD MEMORIAL AWARD

In memory of Susan Lloyd. Scholarship is to support post secondary education at the U of M. For determination and perseverance in progressing in studies despite significant obstacles to such progress. *\$1,900, one award. Apply to: U of M, Faculty of Law.*

SUSANNE AGOPSOWICZ MEMORIAL VOLUNTEER SCHOLARSHIP

The Susanne Agopsowicz Memorial Volunteer Scholarship is given to a 4th year student nominated and voted on by the student body. *\$350, one award. Apply to: ACAD.*

THE CALGARY FOUNDATION ENTRANCE AWARD

An entrance scholarship to SAIT students registered in a diploma or a certificate program. Preference given to a single parent with financial need. *\$500, one award. Apply to: SAIT.*

TRENT BOUCHARD MEMORIAL AWARD

The Bouchard family established this scholarship in loving memory of Trent, a cherished son and brother. This scholarship is awarded to students with satisfactory academic standing entering their 2nd or 3rd year in the Faculty of Agriculture at the U of A. Recipients selected on the basis of leadership qualities as demonstrated by community involvement and extracurricular activities. Preference given to students with a positive attitude. *\$750, two awards. By nomination from the Faculties of Agriculture, Forestry, and Home Economics, U of A.*

WILLIAM M. NORTON SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for a 2nd year medical student at the U of C in financial need. *\$1,000, one award. Apply to: U of C.*

GRADUATE STUDENTS

ACHIEVERS IN MEDICAL SCIENCE
