About Daryl K. "Doc" Seaman

Doc Seaman has been described as a hero, icon, pioneer, philanthropist, visionary and legend. On the list of his many achievements, he was an original owner of the Calgary Flames and was instrumental in bringing them to Calgary in 1980. Among his many accomplishments, Doc was also known for his wartime experiences as a World War II pilot, and for his civic contribution as a member of the Royal Commission on Economic Union and Development Prospects for Canada, 1982-1985. Doc received two honorary Doctor of Laws degrees and was appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada. His philanthropic giving ranged from supporting education and medical research to funding entrepreneurial initiatives. Doc's love for ranching, hockey and sports, and his dedication to community will leave a lasting legacy for years to come.

About the Fund

In accordance with the Will of Daryl K. Seaman, the purpose of grants from the Daryl K. Seaman Canadian Hockey Fund is to support

- all aspects of amateur ice hockey in Canada on a nation-wide basis;
- registered Canadian amateur athletic associations; and
- other general charitable purposes as the Board of Directors of The Calgary Foundation shall determine.

2011 Application Guidelines

- Applications can only be considered from Qualified Donees under the Income Tax Act of Canada, to support their charitable work. To see what kinds of organizations are Qualified Donees, go to <http://www.charitycentral.ca/node/305>
- The fund is an endowment fund thus only a portion of the income will be granted each year. In 2011, the total amount of grants will not exceed \$400,000.
- Both large and small project proposals will be of interest, including grassroots activities that encourage young people to learn about, enjoy and play amateur sport, are welcome.
- Previous recipients of a Daryl K. Seaman Canadian Hockey Fund grant cannot apply until the prior grant's activity is completed and the final report has been accepted.
- Proposals must be for activities taking place after the grant decision date of December 31, 2011. Retroactive expenses cannot be supported.

- Only applications using this template will be considered.
- **Applications must be sent by email to doc@thecalgaryfoundation.org and received no later than noon MST September 15, 2011.** Late applications will not be considered.
- Please also include the following attachments with your electronic application:
 - List of Board members, their year of election and contact information
 - Staff list and positions
 - Audited financial statements for the last fiscal year
 - Current annual budget (revenue & expenses)
- You must also send one complete hard copy, including the contact information and signature of the Qualified Donee's Board Chairperson by September 25, 2011.
- A Grants Advisory Committee will review proposals, and final decisions will be made by the Board of Directors of The Calgary Foundation.
- Decisions will be announced by December 31, 2011.
