



Every Woman Can: The Maria Eriksen Memorial Bursary

As an outspoken voice for the advancement and equality of women, Dr. Maria Eriksen was a social advocate involved with various initiatives since the women's movement began in the 1970s. Her most recent project was tackling a huge issue facing Alberta's immigrants—obtaining the Canadian accreditation or training they require in order to become fully employed in their field.

Dr. Eriksen was the founding chair of the Immigrant Access Fund Society of Alberta (IAF), a nonprofit organization that offers micro loans to internationally trained and educated immigrants to help overcome the financial barriers they face in becoming able to work in their field in Alberta.

In 2008, Dr. Eriksen was made an officer of the Order of Canada for her lifetime dedication to making social change in her community

Dr. Eriksen was also the founding member and chair of the Famous Five Foundation. Taking her vision for change beyond the local community, Dr. Eriksen also sat on the board of directors of the new Alberta Global Forum, an initiative that brings people together to debate on issues that affect the province.

Dr. Eriksen set up an endowed scholarship through the Calgary Sexual Health Centre (which she played a major role in forming) and also gave back to community through the Maria K. Eriksen and Harold Hanen Fund at The Calgary Foundation.

VALUE: \$2000, two bursaries

CONDITIONS: The Maria Eriksen Memorial Bursary funds professional development or technical training at an accredited institution to support the successful transition of an individual's life in Canada. The successful candidate must be an immigrant woman residing in Alberta who is attending school in order to return to her pre-immigration field of work. Applicants must be in financial need and currently enrolled in an accredited educational institution. (Check with your school if you are not sure if they are accredited.)
