



Animals Needing a Home, Have a New Home



Every year, the **Calgary Humane Society (CHS)** provides thousands of animals a safe refuge from abuse, neglect and homelessness. CHS has one of the lowest euthanasia rates in Canada so the vast majority of these animals find a new, loving home.

Now, through the generous support of the Calgary community - including several donors at The Calgary Foundation, the Calgary Humane Society also has a new home.

Located on land that was donated by the City of Calgary, the new SE facility which was officially opened in March, 2006, will appropriately and safely house the ever-increasing animal population while continuing to provide educational and outreach programs for animal lovers throughout southern Alberta.

This state-of-the-art facility includes individual ventilation and drainage in animal areas. These improvements will control disease, enhance health, decrease stress and increase the adoptions of the animals in the Calgary Humane Society's care.

A major supporter of CHS, **TCF Donor Brett Wilson** explains his philanthropic choice by saying, "My partner at FirstEnergy, Jim Davidson, co-chaired the capital campaign for the CHS, so first and foremost, I wanted to support Jim's effort because he always supports my causes. Secondly, the Calgary Humane Society is a cause that's close to everyone's heart, but not always close to their wallets. They needed my support."
